Our speakers will be writing an article for an e-book, and they will connect before the event, to ensure a good experience.

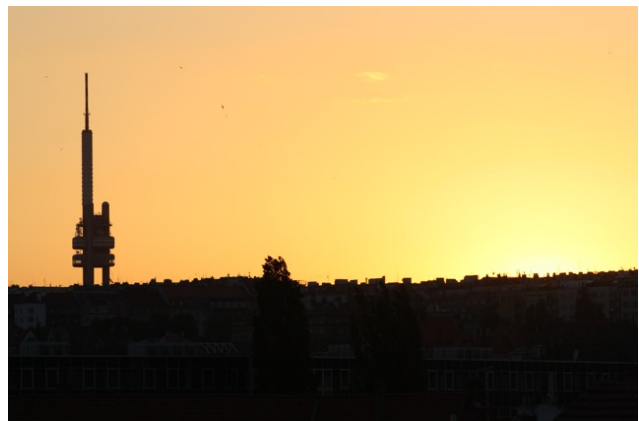
The venue
